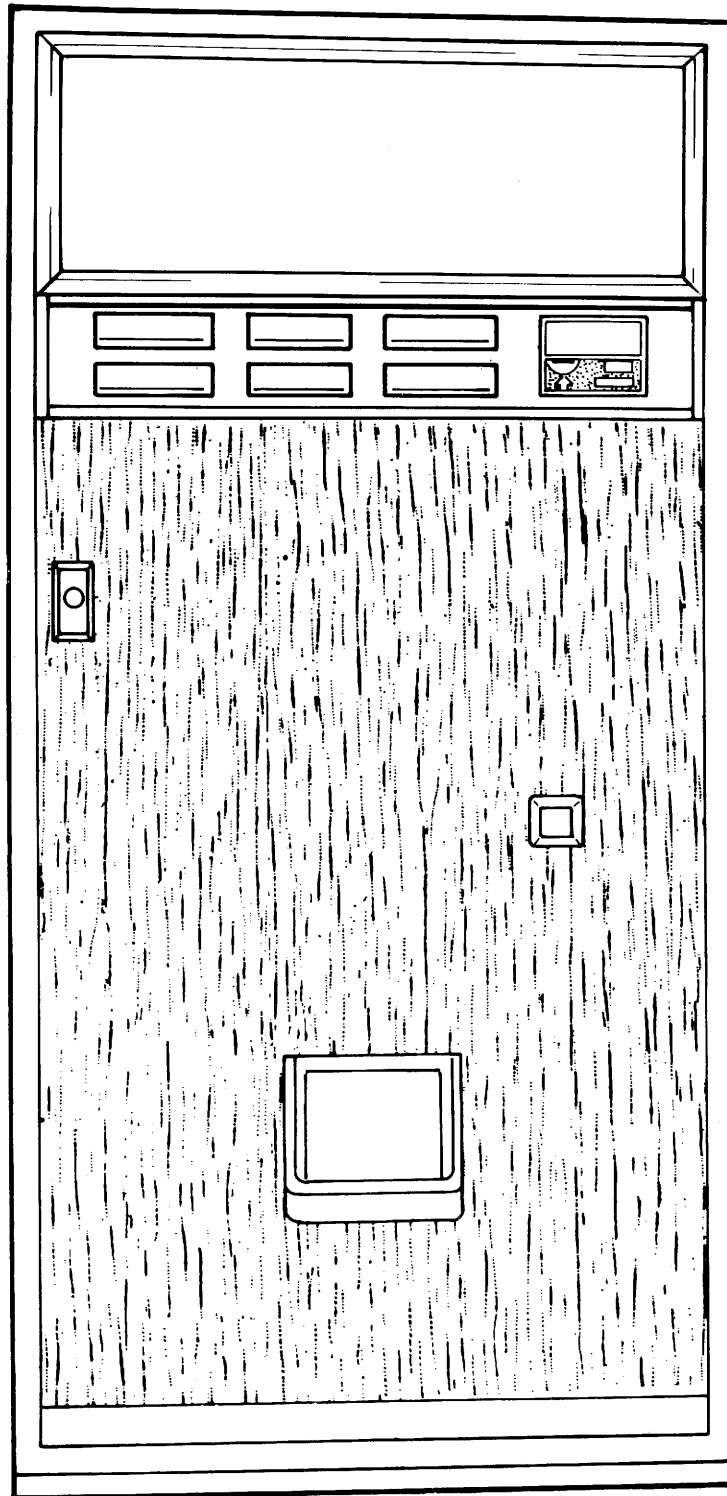

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INTRODUCTION:

This Service and Parts Manual contains information on the Can Juice (6) Six Selection Vendor, which has the capability of using either a single price or a four price coin mechanism. The vendor has the open front dispensing unit for easy visual account of inventory.

COINAGE:

Single Price Changer:

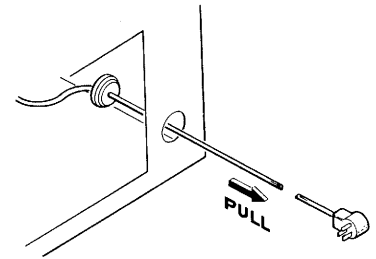
Accepts nickels, dimes and quarters. Selection of ONE vend price, 5¢ through \$1.55 adjustable in 5¢ increments. Change payback is in 5¢ increments as long as adequate change is available in change tubes.

Four Price Changer:

Accepts nickels, dimes and quarters. Selection of FOUR vend prices, 5¢ increments. Change payback is in 5¢ increments as long as adequate change is available in change tubes; tube escrow until selection.

INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS:

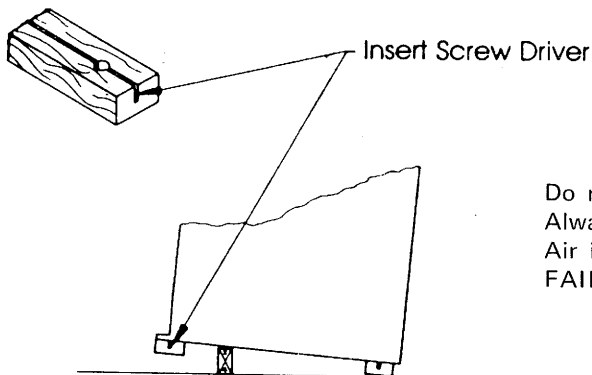
1. Remove all packing material in a manner not to damage the finish or exterior of that Vendor. To unlock the door, the key will be found taped inside the Coin Return Cup. Remove all shipping brackets, inner packing material, and tape from that Vendor. To try to operate the Vendor without removing the tape from the moving parts may result in damage.
2. Record the Model Number and Serial Number of the Vendor and refer to these numbers on all inquiries and correspondence pertaining to that Vendor.
3. This Vendor was thoroughly inspected before leaving the Factory, and the Carrier has accepted this Vendor as their responsibility. Any damages or irregularities should be noted at the time of delivery and immediately reported to the Delivering Carrier. Request a written Inspection Report from the Claims Inspector to file any freight claims for damage. File claim with CARRIER . . . **NOT** with **MANUFACTURER**.
4. To insure safe operation of an electrically equipped vendor, the vendor must be grounded. To verify that the receptacle is properly grounded, connect one probe of a test light to the screw holding the receptacle cover. Insert the other probe into the opening of each outlet. If the test light does not light when placed in either side of the receptacle, the receptacle is not grounded. To provide a proper ground use an adapter which has a ground wire attached. The wire should be attached or connected to a ground such as a water pipe. If the receptacle is grounded, but is not the three-prong type, an adapter may be used. Attach the wire to a ground or the receptacle cover securing screw. Receptacles with three (3) female openings: to verify that the receptacle is properly grounded and polarized, insert one probe of a voltmeter (set to check AC line voltage) or a test light, in the ground terminal position (hole) of the three position receptacle; insert the other probe (of voltmeter or test light) in the L.H. slot (if ground "hole" is up) or the R.H. slot (if ground "hole" is down). You should read 115 VAC on the voltmeter, or the test light should light.



If you find that the above is not the result, you should contact a licensed electrician to correctly polarize and/or ground the receptacle to insure safe operation.

Consult local, state and federal codes for compliance before installation of the vendor.

5. The vendor requires a 115-volt/60-cycle, 20 amp electrical power source. As the Vendor is plugged in, the following things should happen:
 - a. The Display Light should come on.
 - b. The Correct Change Circuit should be activated.
 - c. The SOLD-OUT or EMPTY lights should come on.
 - d. The C.R.E.M. Circuit of the Changer should be activated to allow acceptance of coins.
 - e. Evaporator Motor and Refrigeration should run.
6. Remove knock-a-way support, by inserting screwdriver and splitting the knock-a-way into. Turn the Leveling Screws in as far as possible. Position the Vendor in its' place of operation. **LEAVE AT LEAST (4) INCHES OF SPACE BEHIND THE VENDOR FOR PROPER AIR CIRCULATION.** Level the Vendor, making sure all levelers are touching the floor. The Vendor **MUST** be level for proper operation and acceptance of coins through the Coin Mechanism. If the Vendor is properly leveled, it should not rock or teeter on any of the Levelers.



WARNING

Do not block the Ventilating Louvers in front or in rear of the Vendor. Always allow free ventilation behind a Bank Installation, so that Exhaust Air is not trapped. Failure to do so could result in **REFRIGERATION FAILURE**.

PRICE SETTING:

Any 110-volt, Single Price or Four Price Coin Mechanism can be used, depending on which way the Coinage Selection Switch is set.

Position the Coinage Selection Switch on that Control Box at the selection which agrees with the changer being used.

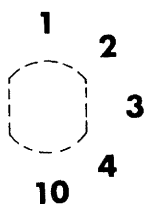
With a Single-Price Changer, the Coinage Selection Switch should be in the Single-Price Position. All selections will now vend at the same price.

With a Four-Price Changer, the Coinage Selection Switch should be in the Four-Price Position. Now you are able to sell products at four different prices, if so desired. The selections are zoned or priced as follows:

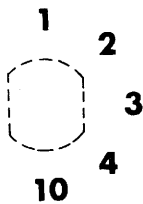
- Selection 1: No. 1 Price or Zone
- Selection 2: No. 2 Price or Zone
- Selection 3: No. 3 Price or Zone
- Selection 4: No. 4 Price or Zone
- Selection 5: Any one of the Prices or Zones
- Selection 6: Any one of the Prices or Zones

Selections 5 and 6 are controlled through the (2) Rotary Switches on the Control Box. The Rotary Switches are labeled as illustrated.

Even with a Four-Price Changer you can set all the prices or zones the same and thereby have a Single-Price Vendor.

PRICE-SETTING INSTRUCTIONS

COINAGE TYPE: Coinco 5¢-\$1.50 single price changer.

1. Unplug coin mechanism from machine.
2. Remove coin acceptor from coin mechanism. (See Fig. A.)
3. Removing the coin acceptor reveals a switch module with five miniature rocker switches numbered 1 through 5. Each one of the switches corresponds to a given price as follows: No. 1 = 5¢, No. 2 = 10¢, No. 3 = 20¢, No. 4 = 40¢, No. 5 = 80¢. To set the vend price, add the value of the rocker switches in the ON position. Example: switches No. 1 and No. 2 are in the ON position; since No. 1 = 5¢ and No. 2 = 10¢ the vend price is set at 15¢. (See Fig. B.)
4. To set the change tubes to either accept or reject quarters when change tubes are empty, remove the back coverplate and check the position of the white wire on the change tube empty switch. To accept quarters the white wire should be on the piggyback terminal on the common terminal. To reject quarters the white wire should be on the normally open terminal. (See Fig. C.)

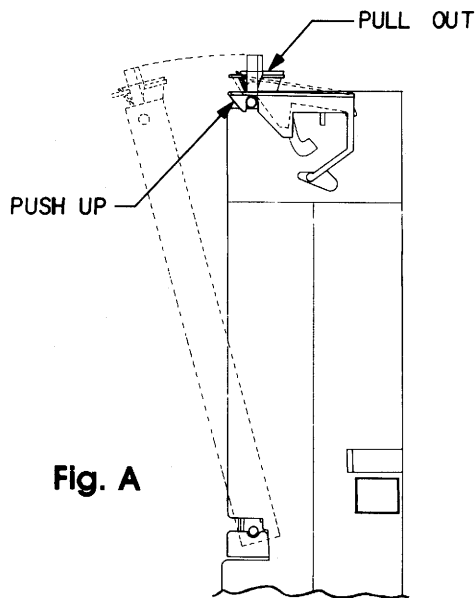

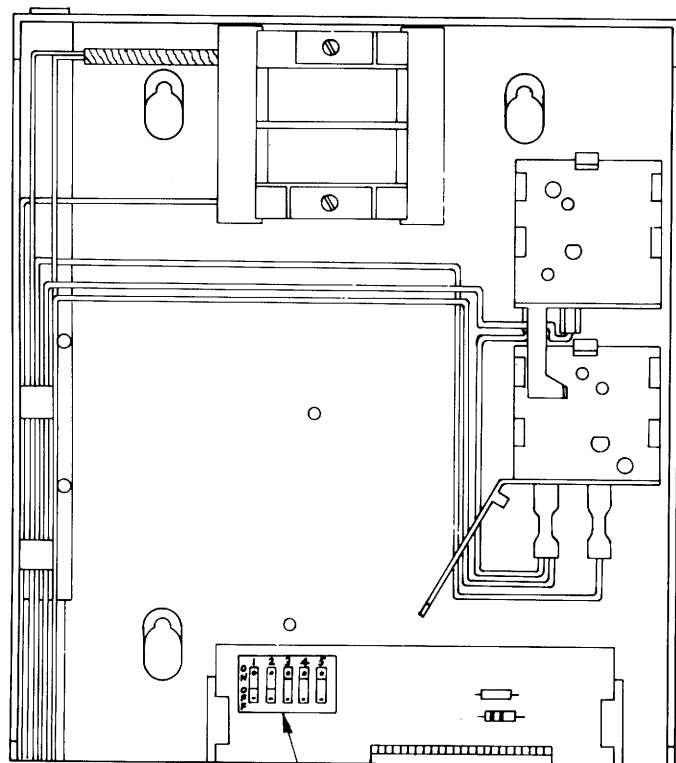

SWITCH MODULE

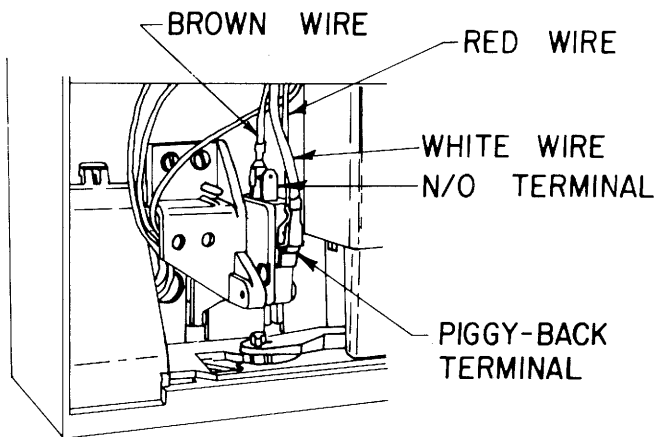

PRICE-SETTING INSTRUCTIONS

COINAGE TYPE: Coinco 5¢ - \$3.15 Four-Price Changer.

1. With power on, remove the Acceptor (see Fig. A); and place in an area free of dirt.
2. The Price Switch Module has six miniature rocker switches, numbered (1) thru (6) make sure they are all in the off position. These switches correspond to prices as follows:
1=5¢, 2=10¢, 3=20¢, 4=40¢, 5=80¢, & 6=\$1.60.
Set the Vend Price by adding the value of the rocker switches that are in the on position. For example switches # 1 and # 3 are on that equals 25¢.
3. After setting the desired Vend Price on the Price Switch Module momentarily depress the Price Arming Switch, then within 10 seconds press one of the selection buttons on the front of the machine.

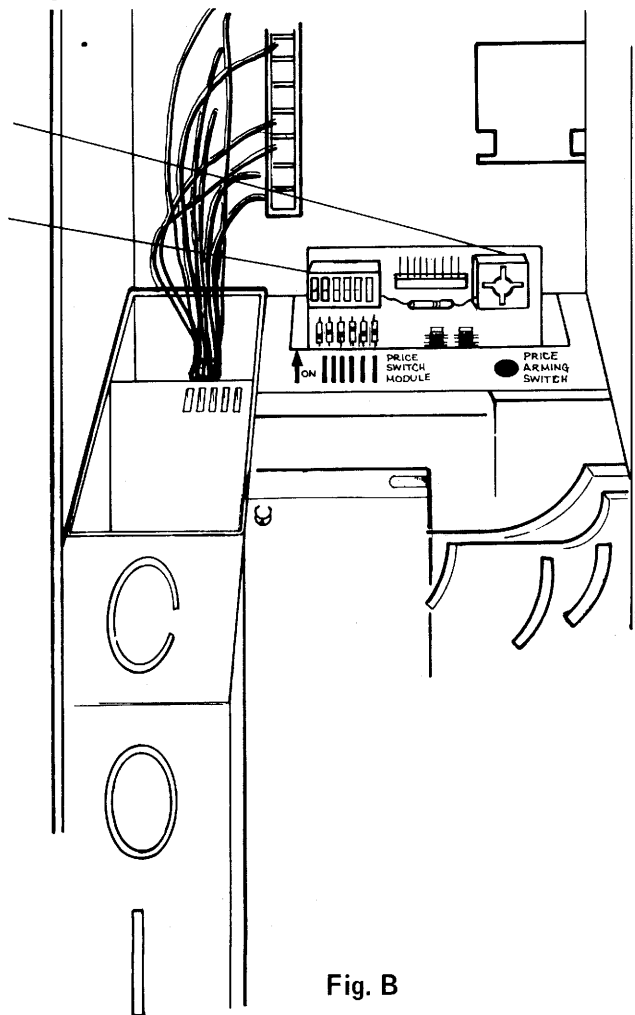

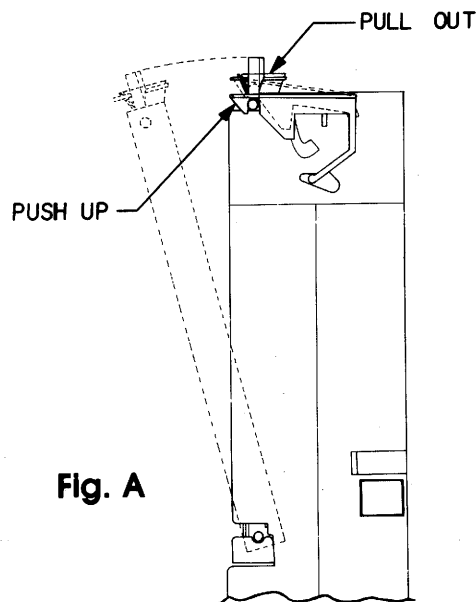

The price is now set for all selections on that Price Zone to the preset price on the Price Switch Module. Repeat this step for all (4) Price Zones during initial installation. For the Price Zone (s) that need changing after initial installation repeat this step.

4. When the Price Arming Switch is pressed the Coin Changer will go into a temporary price changing mode. During this cycle, which lasts approximately 10 seconds, the C.R.E.M's will de-energize and vending is possible at this time.
5. After setting all prices, replace the acceptor and test with a variety of coins to insure proper price setting. Product has to be in the selection that you use to set price with. The price will not take if you use a sold out selection to set price.

MARS \$6.35 COIN MECHANISM

1. Unplug Coin Mechanism.
2. Lower Acceptor Assembly by depressing both spring clips. Now rotate Acceptor forward and down. (Fig. 1)
3. The Price Switch Module has seven miniature slide switches numbered one (1) thru seven (7). Make sure they are all in the off position (down). These switches correspond to prices as follows:
1=5¢, 2=10¢, 3=20¢, 4=40¢, 5=80¢, 6=\$1.60, 7=\$3.20. Set the value of the selection by adding the value of the slide switches in the on position (up). Example: Switches one (1) and three (3) are on = 25¢. To move switches use a retracted ball point pen or a small screw driver. **DO NOT USE A GRAPHITE PENCIL POINT.**
4. Set Coin Control Switches on Acceptor using a retracted ball point pen or small screwdriver. **DO NOT USE A GRAPHITE PENCIL POINT.**

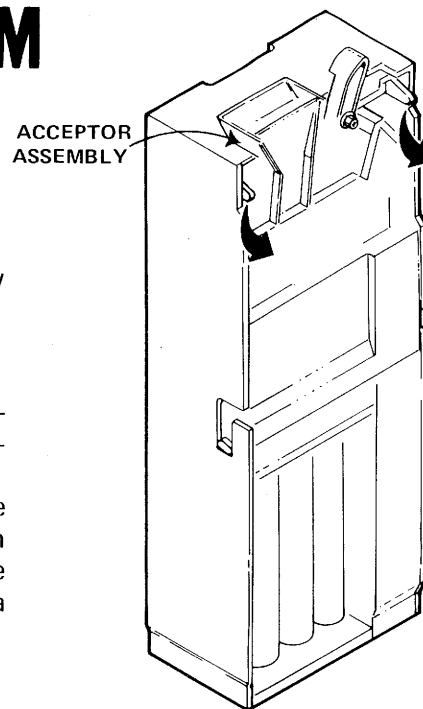
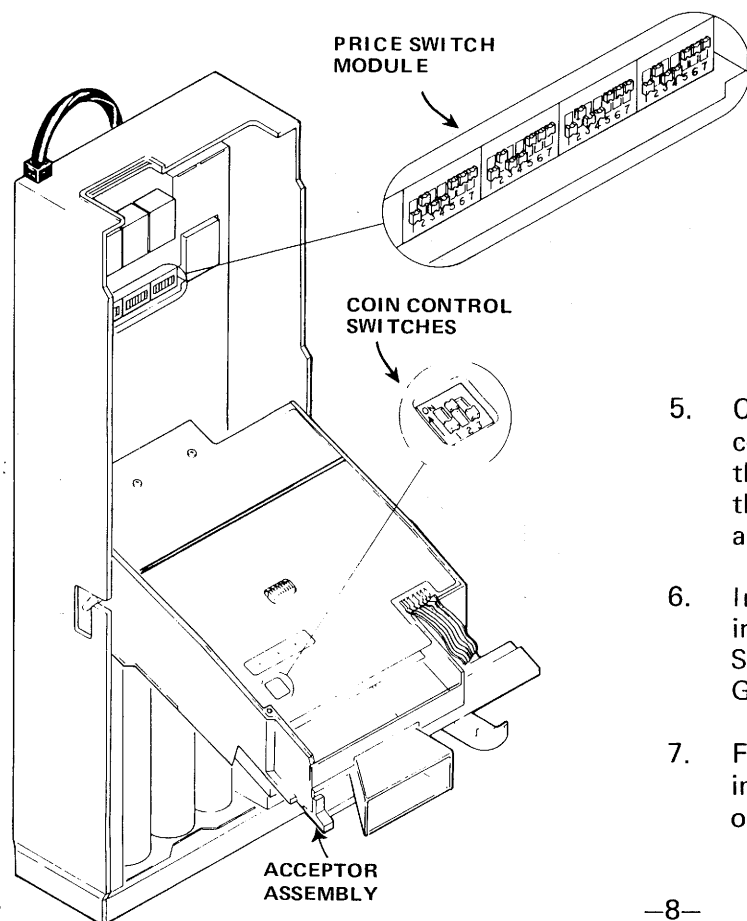

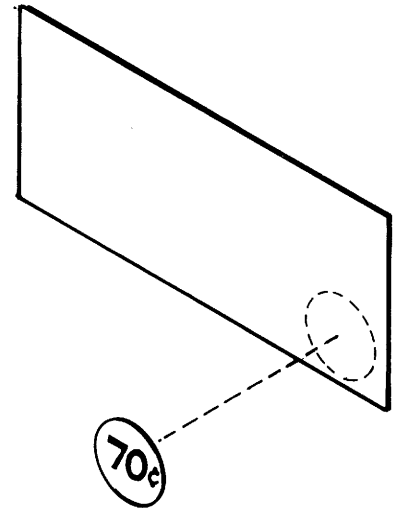
5. Connect power plug. Position or clamp clear of coin cup and coin return lever. Check to see that the blocker light is illuminated indicating that the vendor C.R.E.M. circuit (Line 4) is completed and the change is ready to accept coins.
6. Install Acceptor Assembly in coin changer housing. Check to insure ACCEPTOR IS PROPERLY SEATED WITH BOTH SPRING CLIPS ENGAGED.
7. Fill coin tubes to desired levels by inserting coins into coin tube loading slots located on the front of the coin tubes. Minimum coin levels.
6 Nickels
7 Dimes
6 Quarters (required for dollar acceptance)

PRICE LABELS:

With Single Price Coin Mechanism the Price Label will be part of the Coin Insert Label.

With Four-Price Coin Mechanism the Price Label must be applied to Selection Label as shown.

If the Four-Price Coin Mechanism is set to vend at one price only, then you could use the Coin Insert Label that has the price printed on it just like for the Single Price Coin Mechanism.



LOADING INSTRUCTIONS:

The selections are numbered from left to right when facing vendor. Each selection will hold approximately 50 cans. The selection switches are numbered on back of the Dashboard.

IMPORTANT

After loading, make sure that the products in each selection correspond to the Selection Label. Also make sure that the Vend Prices for each selection are correct.

SELECTION JUMPER:

Any Selection or Vend Mechanism may be by-passed, disconnected or removed from the Vendor with the use of a Jumper Plug. The Vendor will continue to work on all Selections, except for that Selection on which the Jumper Plug is used. The Jumper Plug is inserted in place of the plug of the Selection Harness. With the Jumper Plug in use, the SOLD OUT Light will come on when that Selection Button is pressed.

INSTALLATION CHECK LIST:

Make certain the following steps have been taken or that these conditions exist before starting the Can Vendor.

1. All shipping brackets, packing material and tape have been removed.
2. Vendor is properly located for access to power source outlet and Vendor is level.
3. All components are installed on Vendor and are in good condition.
4. Service Cord plug-in receptable is grounded, or ground adapter has been installed.
5. Coin Mechanism adjustments have been made, if necessary, and Vend Prices are properly set.
6. Vendor has been properly loaded and the flavors in each selection correspond to the Vend Price and the Selection Label in that push button.

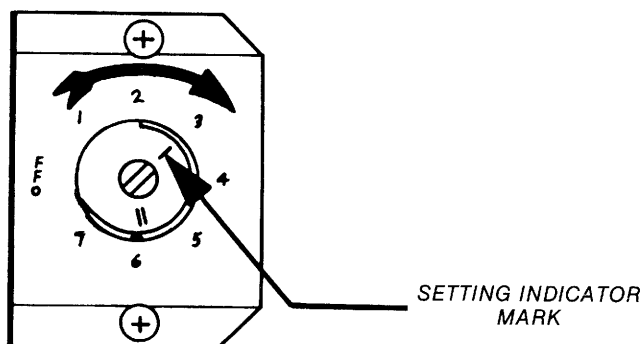
WARNING

This Vendor is equipped with a 5-amp circuit breaker to protect the Vending Circuit only. The Refrigeration System is not on this Circuit Breaker. Refer to Wiring Diagram for the position of this Circuit Breaker.

COLD CONTROL SETTING:

These recommended Cold Control Settings are based on an average temperature, outside the Cabinet, to supply maximum cooling for inside products.

TROUBLE SHOOTING:

BASIC VENDOR:

I. VENDOR REJECTS ALL COINS – DISPLAY LAMP OFF.

- A. Vendor unplugged – plug in Vendor.
- B. Fuse or Circuit Breaker tripped in Supply (building) Outlet – replace fuse, or reset Circuit Breaker.
- C. Damaged or defective Power Cord – repair or replace Service Harness on Refrigeration System
- D. Green, White and Yellow wires unplugged at Refrigeration System – plug wires in.
- E. Door Harness unplugged at Cabinet – make sure the plugs are securely locked together.
- F. Circuit Breaker in Vendor tripped or defective – reset or replace Circuit Breaker.

II. VENDOR REJECTS ALL COINS – DISPLAY LAMP ON.

- A. Vend Mechanism is not in Home Position – return Vend Mechanism to Home Position.
- B. Loose or broken wire on Vend Mechanism – fix wire or replace Harness.
- C. Defective Coin Mechanism - repair or replace Coin Mechanism.
- D. Vendor is not level – level Vendor.
- E. Coin Acceptor dirty – clean Coin Acceptor.
- F. Loose or broken wire to Normal Open Terminal on Full Stroke Switch – repair or replace.

III. VENDOR ACCEPTS COINS, BUT DOES NOT VEND ANY SELECTIONS.

- A. Selector Button stuck, causing electronic shut-down of Coin Mechanism – correct or replace Selector Button or Switch. *(for F-150 only)*
- B. Vend prices set wrong (all too high) – set Vend prices correctly.
- C. Door Plug(s) not completely engaged – make sure plug(s) are locked together.
- D. Defective Coin Mechanism – repair or replace.
- E. Selection Relay defective – replace.

IV. VENDOR ACCEPTS COINS, BUT DOES NOT VEND ON ONE OR MORE SELECTIONS.

- A. Vend Price set incorrectly – set Vend Price correctly.
- B. Selection SOLD-OUT – load Selection.
- C. SOLD-OUT Switch out of adjustment, unplugged, or defective – correct the adjustment, plug in the switch, or replace it.
- D. Selection Switch out of adjustment or defective – readjust switch, or replace.
- E. Loose or Broken Selection Wire – repair or replace.
- F. Defective Coin Mechanism – repair or replace.
- G. Price Switch turned off-Reactivate. (For Selection # 5 and # 6 only)

V. VENDOR VENDS PROPERLY, BUT PAYS BACK WRONG, OR NO CHANGE.

- A. Vend Price set incorrectly – set price correctly.
- B. Changer out of Change – fill Change Tubes.
- C. Defective Coin Mechanism – repair or replace.

- VI. **PRODUCT DOES NOT MATCH SELECTION PUSHED.**
 - A. Product loaded wrong — load product correctly.
 - B. Vend Mechanism plugs crossed — make sure Vend Mechanisms are plugged in correctly.
 - C. Selection Switch stuck ON — make sure Selection Button moves freely.
- VII. **VENDOR FREE VENDS.**
 - A. Defective Coin Mechanism — repair or replace.
 - B. Full-stroke Switch out of adjustment, or defective — readjust switch or replace.
 - C. Can Jump Guard not adjusted properly — adjust Can Jump Guard correctly.
- VIII. **VENDOR VENDS TWO OR MORE CANS WITH ONE SELECTION.**
 - A. Solenoid does not make complete stroke — replace or adjust Solenoid.
 - B. Can Jump Guard not adjusted properly — readjust.

REFRIGERATION SYSTEM:

Know and understand service units, and how they operate. Units may vary, but the operation is basically the same.

Never guess at the problem; solve it by reading the symptoms.

- I. **COMPRESSOR WILL NOT START.**
 - A. Voltage (check to see if compressor has power).
 - 1. Tripped breaker or blown fuse.
 - 2. Wall outlet faulty.
 - 3. Short or tear in Power Cord.
 - 4. Faulty Cold Control.
 - a. Unplug power supply, remove screws from thermostat. Use a jumper wire, or place screw through terminals; then restore power and check to see if the unit runs.
 - 5. Check for improper wiring.
- II. **COMPRESSOR TRIPS ON OVERLOAD.**
 - A. Improper Voltage (117 A.C. normal).
 - 5-10% above, 5% below.
 - B. Overload defective.
 - See VIII, 2.
 - C. Relay defective.
 - See VIII, 3.
 - D. Compressor defective.
 - See VIII, 4
 - E. Start capacitor defective.
 - See VIII, 5.
 - F. Short in other Component.
 - Isolate and eliminate each electrical component until short is found.

- G. Compressor is too hot.
 - 1. Dirty Condenser.
 - 2. Faulty Condenser motor or blade.
 - 3. Restricted air flow.

III. **NOISY OR VIBRATING UNIT:**

- A. Components rubbing or touching each other.
 - 1. Check fan blades and motors.
 - 2. Loose shrouds and harness.
 - 3. Copper tubing.
 - 4. Loose or unsecured parts.
- B. Grommets.
 - 1. Worn, aged.
- C. Compressor.
 - 1. Bad valves.
 - 2. Slugging.
 - 3. Bad windings. (*see index*)
- D. Relay.
 - 1. Frozen in start position. (*see index*)
- E. Low voltage.

IV. **UNIT SHORT CYCLES.**

- A. Cold Control.
 - 1. Differential set too close.
 - 2. Probe in wrong area (i.e. Touching evaporator).

V. **UNIT OPERATES LONG OR CONTINUOUSLY.**

- A. Thermostat faulty.
- B. Air flow restricted.
 - 1. Faulty evaporator motor or blades.
Evaporator coil iced.
 - 2. Air flow blocked by cans placed in front of evaporator.
- C. Gasket leak.
- D. Excessive load.
 - 1. After loading, units run longer to pull out excessive from product.
- E. Shortage of refrigerant or restriction.

VI. **REFRIGERATED SPACE TOO WARM.**

- A. Restricted evaporator air space.
 - 1. Evaporator motor or blades bad.
Evaporator will usually be iced over insulating evaporator.
 - 2. Condenser air flow restricted.
 - a. Plugged or dirty Condenser.
 - b. Condenser motor or blade bad.
 - c. Blade stuck.

3. Condensing space restricted.
A unit placed too close to a wall.
4. Compressor - Bad valves.
5. Leak or restriction.
 - a. Cap tube will start frosting 8 to 10 inches past evaporator connection tube.
 - b. Check for oil around brazed connections.
6. Thermostat improperly set.

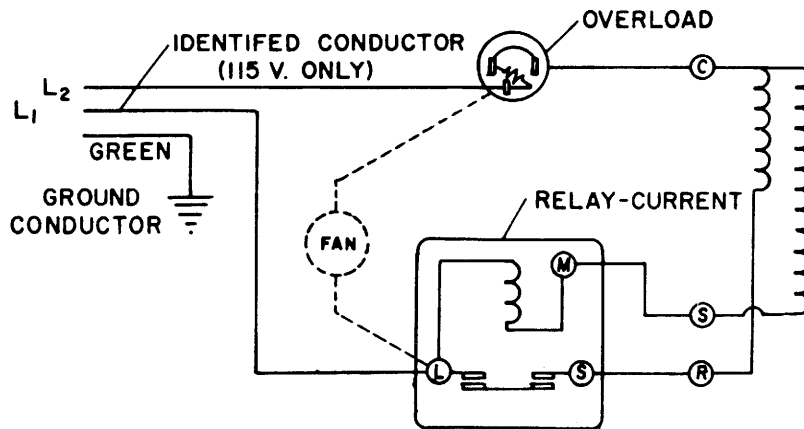
VII. **90% OF ALL REFRIGERATION PROBLEMS ARE ELECTRICAL — START THERE!**

1. Rules for breaking into a sealed hermetic system;
 - A. *DON'T!* If this system was meant to be worked on outside the Factory Service Center, service valves would have been installed.
 - B. The four things that can go wrong with a sealed system and should be repaired at the Factory Service Center are:
 1. *Low Charge.* Low charges are caused usually by leaks; look for oil around seals and welds. Unit will not seal properly.
 2. *Restriction in System (Unit frosts, then melts).* Not cooling properly, low side in vacuum.
 3. *Bad Valves.* Unit does not cool properly; noisy compressor; high, low side — low, high side.
 4. *Oil Breakdown.* When this happens, it's ready to change compressors.
 - C. *REMEMBER. DO NOT* break into a sealed system for any reason. Send the unit to the Factory Service Center.

VIII. **TROUBLE SHOOTING UNIT CIRCUITS USING OHM-VOLT METER.**

1. Using volt meter, check power source.
2. Check overload. (*Note: Power must be off and fan circuit open*).
 - A. Using Ohm meter terminals 1 & 3 for continuity. If no continuity, overload may be tripped. Wait 10 minutes and try again. If still no continuity, overload is defective; replace.
3. Checking Relay: See Attachment No. 1.
 - A. Pull lead terminals or relay off the compressor, depending upon which type of relay is used. (*Note: Keep relay upright.*)
 - B. Check terminals 1 & S, or L & S. Replace relay if there is continuity.
 - C. Check terminals 1 & M, or L & M. Replace relay if there is no continuity.
4. Checking Compressor: See Attachment No. 2.
5. Checking Capacitor:
 - A. Put screwdriver across terminals of capacitor and observe spark.
 - B. Check relay terminals 1 & L with meter on R x 1 scale, if it has continuity, replace.

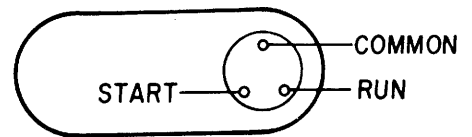

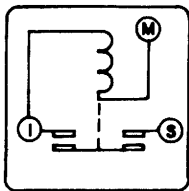

CARE AND CLEANING:

NOTE: Always disconnect Power Source before cleaning.

CABINET EXTERIOR:

Wash with a mild detergent and water, rinse and dry thoroughly. Wax occasionally with a quality car wax. Plastic exterior parts may be cleaned with a quality plastic cleaner.

CABINET INTERIOR:

Wash with a mild detergent and water. Odors may be eliminated by including baking soda or ammonia in cleaning solution. Remove and clean Drain Hose to eliminate any deposits that may restrict condensate water flow.

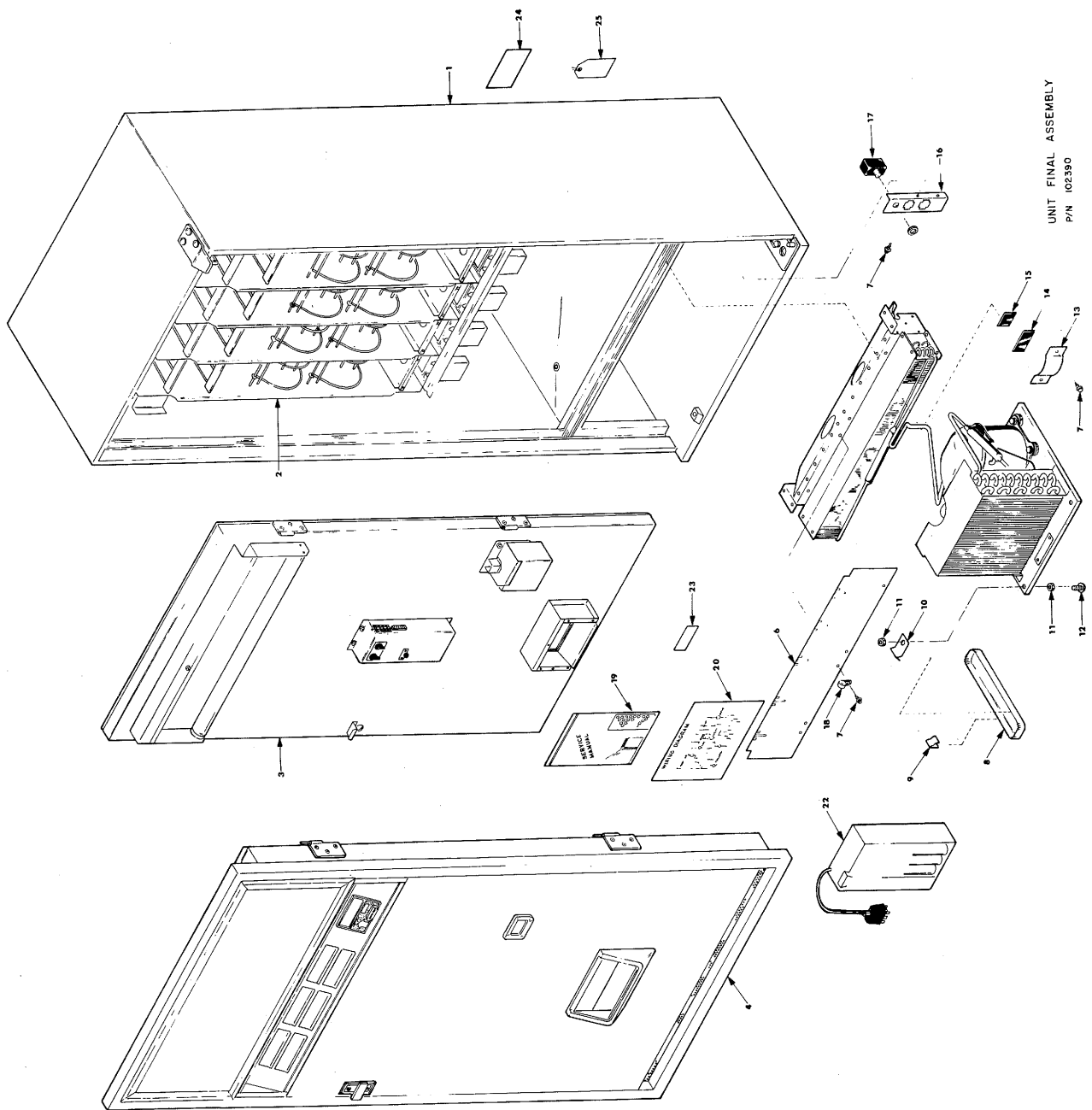
The Vend Mechanisms *must* be kept clean. Any build up of syrup deposits can cause these mechanisms to malfunction. Use soap and water with great care so as not to get water into the Electrical Components.

REFRIGERATION SYSTEM:

Clean dust from Condenser and Screen in Front Door with soft bristle brush, or vacuum cleaner. Remove any dirt or debris from Refrigeration System Compartment. Remove and clean Condensation Pan.

COIN ACCEPTOR:

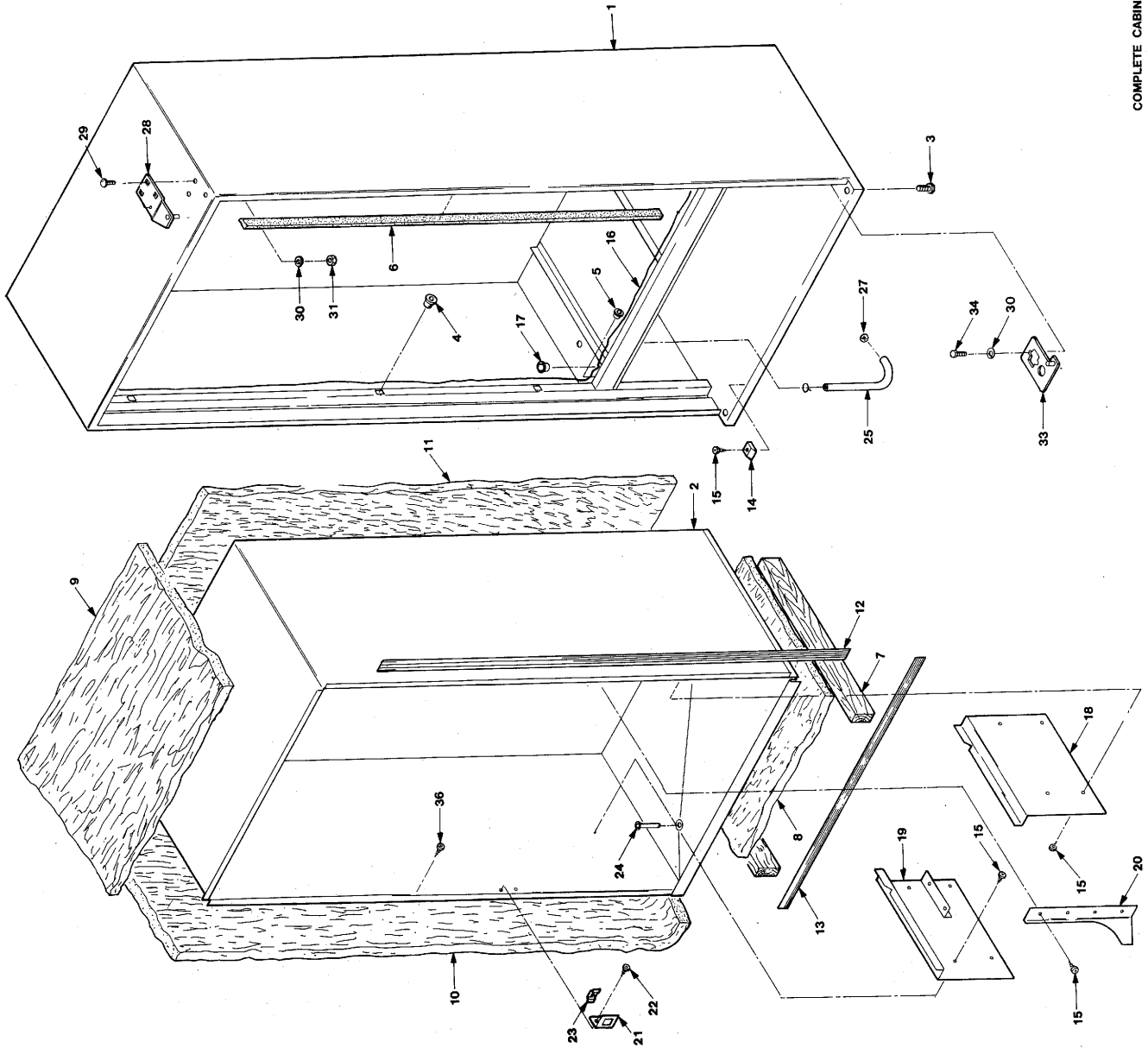
Remove Coin Acceptor from Coin Mechanism. Using a damp cloth, wipe down the coin paths til they are clean.

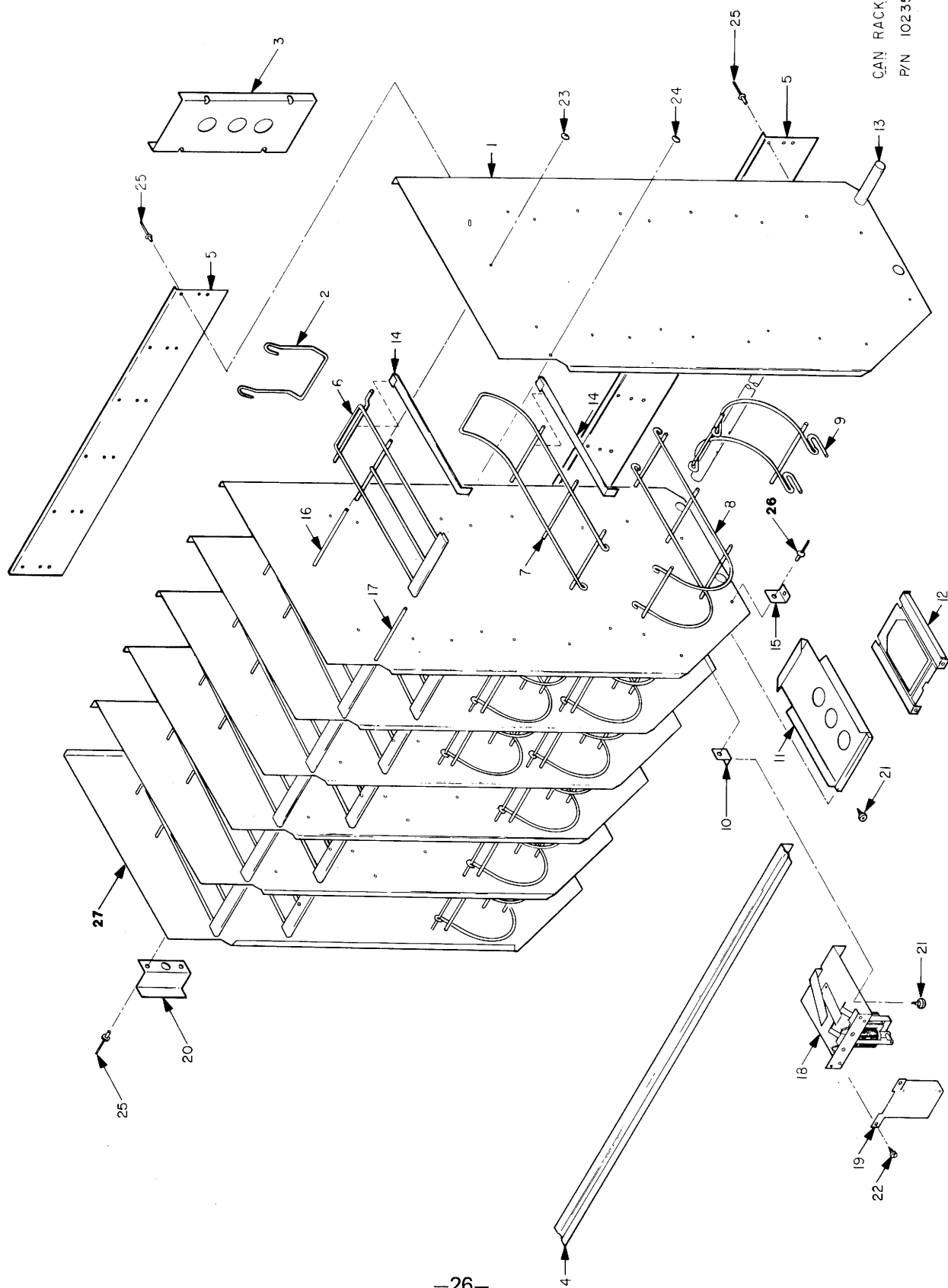
EJECTOR MECH. WIRING SCHEMATIC
